## Ministries Spotlight

### *St. Andrew Parish Library*

The St. Andrew parish Library (formed in 1995) offers Christian materials (books, videos, CD's & DVD's) for all ages. Over 2500 items are available on many subjects. The Library offers a pleasant environment for small group meetings and training sessions. Located in the basement of the Parish Office Building, the Library is available on weekdays during regular office hours (not Monday mornings), and on Sundays after Masses until 12:15 pm. A volunteer Library Committee meets three times a year and welcomes suggestions and new committee members, with or without previous library background.
